

Travel Scam Avoidance Checklist (55+ Traveller Edition)

A calm, printable reminder that most travel scams can be avoided with a pause, a polite no, and a willingness to walk away.

Before You Leave

- Tell your bank where you're going
- Set daily card and ATM limits
- Photograph important documents
- Save emergency numbers digitally and on paper
- Carry a backup payment method, stored separately
- Decide in advance that you are allowed to say no

On Arrival

- Ignore unsolicited offers of help or transport
- Use official taxis, hotel transfers, or ride-hailing apps
- Confirm prices before getting into vehicles
- Store passport securely, not in hand
- If tired or overwhelmed, go straight to your accommodation

Money & ATMs

- Use ATMs inside banks, hotels, or shopping centres
- Shield your PIN completely
- Decline help from strangers
- Cancel the transaction if anything feels off
- Carry small amounts of cash separately

Strangers & Social Situations

- Be cautious of overly fast friendliness
- Do not follow anyone to a second location
- Watch drinks being poured
- Pay as you go
- Leave early if something feels wrong

Officials, Tours & Services

- Ask for official ID
- Refuse on-the-spot cash payments or fines
- Agree on prices before tours or taxis begin
- Clarify what is included and what is not
- If rushed or pressured, decline

Final reminder: You do not owe anyone your time, your money, or your politeness at the expense of your comfort. The safest travellers aren't suspicious — they're unhurried.
